

Effective Dates, Affected Areas and Affected Water Sources

- Modified Phase III water shortage restrictions are effective for Tampa and the entire Tampa Bay region on June 5, 2017.
- The restrictions affect all water users – City system and well – in the City of Tampa, with the exception of locations where reclaimed water is in use.

Lawn Watering Schedule

- Lawn watering is limited to a once-per-week schedule. The following is a schedule and summary of the restrictions unless your city or county has a different once-per-week schedule or more stringent restrictions.

❖ Addresses ending in 0 or 1 may irrigate on	Monday
❖ Addresses ending in 2 or 3 may irrigate on	Tuesday
❖ Addresses ending in 4 or 5 may irrigate on	Wednesday
❖ Addresses ending in 6 or 7 may irrigate on	Thursday
❖ Addresses ending in 8 or 9 may irrigate on	Friday
❖ Common areas with no address or locations with mixed addresses may irrigate on	Friday

- Allowable watering hours are before 8 a.m. or after 6 p.m. regardless of property size.

Landscape Watering Times

Handwatering and micro-irrigation of plants (other than lawns) can be done on any day but is limited to the hours of before 8 a.m. or after 6 p.m.

New Lawn & Plant Establishment

New lawns and plants have a 60-day establishment period. On days 1-30, they may be watered any day of the week. During days 31-60, they may be watered approximately every other day. Even-numbered addresses may water on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday. Odd-numbered addresses may be watered on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday.

Fountains

- Fountains and other aesthetic water features may only operate eight hours per day. The regular hours of operation can be selected by the owner but must be posted.

Car Washing

- Car washing is limited to once per week on the designated watering day for the location.
- Commercial car washes, including mobile detailing businesses, may still operate on any day.
- Emergency vehicles and other first responder vehicles may be washed as needed.
- Fundraising events are prohibited unless they were scheduled prior to tightening measure.

Pressure Washing

- Pressure washing is allowed once a year and for necessary purposes, such as prior to painting or sealing, in order to maintain a paint or material warranty, to address a health or safety hazard or to comply with health laws.

System Maintenance

- Each zone may be run once weekly for up to 10 minutes per zone for maintenance. An attendant must be on-site and visible during maintenance operation.

Chemical Treatments

- Self-applied chemical treatments may be watered in only on the permitted day for the location.
- Commercially applied chemicals must be marked with a dated yard card and watered in within 24 hours following application during permitted hours.

Other Water Uses

- Sprinkler-like devices used on a lawn for recreational purposes shall be limited to the lawn and landscape restrictions.

Deed Restrictions and Community Standards Enforcement

- Homeowners associations and other entities must suspend any requirement to replace lawns, pressure wash, or engage in any other activity that increases water use during the water shortage declaration.
